

## Fetten Named Senior Vice President - Corporate Ship Refits at Carnival Corporation & PLC

He also spent 12 years at Hamburg-based Blohm & Voss Shipyard, holding a number of executive positions, as well as four years at Barthels & Luders, a Hamburg-based harbor repair company.

A past member of the board of directors of Grand Bahamas Shipyard, Fetten holds degrees in naval architecture and welding engineering from the University of Hamburg.
