Making Every Drop Count

Our Every Drop Counts water conservation strategy focuses on using less and reclaiming more, reducing our impact and helping to preserve the precious freshwater resources these thriving communities rely on, and doing our part to protect the delicate ecosystems that depend on clean seas.

- Advanced Wastewater Treatment Systems are now in place at four of the ports that we own and operate (Puerta Maya, Grand Turk, Amber Cove and Celebration Key) with two additional systems under development at RelaxAway, Half Moon Cay and Mahogany Bay.
- Once completed, six of our seven destinations will feature advanced wastewater capabilities, underscoring our commitment to responsible environmental operations.
- The treated byproduct is reused for landscape irrigation, saving significant amounts of water. In 2025, approximately two million gallons of treated water was reused, equivalent to the yearly irrigation needs of one football field of 1.63 acres.
- In Puerta Maya, we repurpose organic matter captured in the water purification process as compost, a valuable resource that is then distributed among local farmers.
- We support ocean health by partnering with local communities, scientists and conservation groups through our artificial reef program, with trained divers monitoring coral health and water quality at Isla Tropicale and Puerta Maya.
- Some of our ports even utilize rainwater for water-based fire sprinkler systems and restroom plumbing.

In 2025 more than 52 million gallons of fresh water was sustainably produced from seawater in reverse osmosis plants at Amber Cove, Celebration Key, Princess Cays and RelaxAway, Half Moon Cay.

Less Left Over

Our Less Left Over food waste reduction strategy extends far beyond our ships. We've integrated sustainable practices across our exclusive destinations, minimizing food waste to ensure there is less left over.

- In 2025 at Amber Cove, we repurposed 24 tons of food waste as livestock feed distributed to local farmers.
- In Puerto Maya, mineral-rich byproduct from the wastewater treatment plant's process is incorporated into the compost. Using this byproduct as a soil filler reduces reliance on non-renewable resources and improves the local environment.

Reducing Single-Use Items & Plastics

By working to eliminate plastic waste and single-use items, we are helping to safeguard the environments of our ports and the local communities.

- We have asked our food and beverage retailers across our ports to replace single-use plastics with biodegradable containers.
- Our port destination team members use refillable water bottles versus disposable plastic containers. We also use reusable waste bags for landscape waste.
- In 2025, our team members participated in 29 coastal cleanup events, removing approximately 17 tons of waste – including discarded trash, various types of plastic materials and other debris – from coastal areas and communities near our ports and owned destinations.

Expanding Recycling

Through impactful initiatives and sustainable solutions, we are working to support local communities in advancing waste management systems while preserving their natural beauty and environmental integrity.

- In 2025, across all our owned ports, we diverted ~122 tons of waste from local landfills by recycling materials like aluminum cans, plastics, glass, cardboard and paper.

At our Amber Cove destination in the Dominican Republic, we are teaming up with local leaders and an environmental group in Maimón, Puerto Plata to tackle waste head-on. Our team members worked with community leaders, neighbors and businesses to share tips for sorting waste at home and at work. Now, the project is expanding with door-to-door education, new community 'Clean Points' – designated collection sites for sorted recyclables for later delivery to recycling facilities – and local champions leading the way.

By working with Maimón to promote community-driven action, we are helping to reduce landfill waste and further strengthen the area's appeal as a great place to live and a vibrant tourist destination.
